


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l. 2 Samuel 5-7; ll-l2; l Kings 3, 8, ll



Make the David and Solomon mini book and have your family color their book as you read the pages inside.




3.2 Samuel II

Summarize, listen to, or popcorn read (someone reads then calls on someone else) this chapter. After reading together, talk about the good and bad choices David made and what good choices your children can make in their life. Play charades - acting out good and bad choices while your family guesses what is being acted out.

Read the verse together. Tell your children to make a heart with their hands or point to their heart when they hear the word "heart." When they hear "walking in His ways" they can walk around the room. Sing some songs like: "I'm trying to Be Like Jesus" (Children's Songbook, pg. 78), "Love One Another" (Hymns, pg. 308), or "I'll Walk With You" (Children's Songbook).



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
