## PRINTING

The majority of our downloads are formatted to print on 8.5x11" paper, unless otherwise noted. You may print at home or at a local print shop. We recommend using a recent version of Adobe Acrobat PDF Reader to view and print your files. It is available for free online. If you run into problems with pages being cut off, select "fit to page" in your print dialogue box to make sure it fits on your page correctly.

To print large page sizes (anything larger than 8.5x11"), we recommend going to a local print shop like Kinko's, Staples, AlphaGraphics, etc. and ask them to print your file as a black and white "engineer print" or "blueprint." These larger prints are big and fun, and fairly inexpensive.

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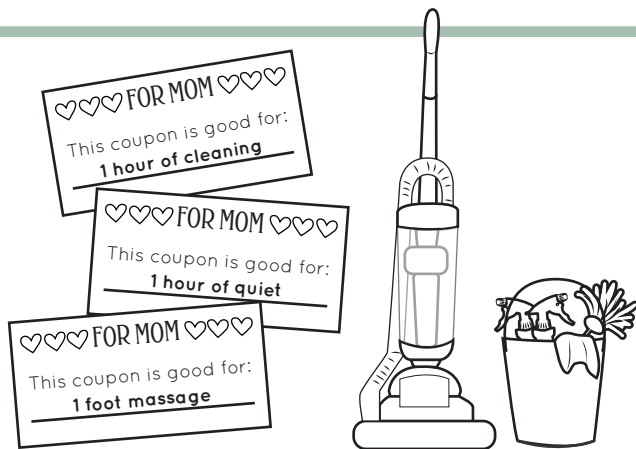
# FAST

Fun, Awesome Scripture Time!

## 1. John 3:16-17

Cut several hearts out of construction paper. We recommend 1-10 hearts for each child in your family. Help your children write "My Heavenly Father loves me" on each heart. They can hang their hearts above their bed.

Then sing "My Heavenly Father Loves Me" (Children's Songbook, pg. 228) together and talk about how Heavenly Father shows us that He loves us.



## 2. John 2:1-11

Read these scriptures with your family and talk about this story. Make note that in the Joseph Smith Translation for verse 4, Jesus responded to His mother by asking, "Woman, what wilt thou have me to do for thee? That will I do." Jesus gave us a good example of how we should treat our mothers. Give your children time to think of something nice they can do for their mother.

## 3. John 3:3

After reading this verse as a family, sing the verse to the tune of "Mary had a Little Lamb." Read the first line and then start singing with "Verily, verily..." Sing as many times as you want. It may help to make a rhythm by patting your legs or clapping to help you stay on tune.
