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Spiritual Gifts Matthew 25:14-30

Read Matthew 25:14-30 and teach your family the parable of the talents. Discuss as a family what spiritual gifts and physical gifts are and that these are gifts and abilities that come from Heavenly Father.

Activities for Families

As a family complete the Gift Sort activity to help your family understand the difference between spiritual and physical gifts.

Read D&C 46:11-12

11 For all have not every gift given unto them; for there are many gifts, and to every man is given a gift by the Spirit of God.

12 To some is given one, and to some is given another, that all may be profited thereby.



Discuss what spiritual gifts each member of your family has. For ideas of possible spiritual gifts look in True to the Faith on page 165.



Put each family member's name in a bowl. Have everyone draw a name. Each person is going to write a letter to the person they drew, tell them how you see the way they share their spiritual gift and mention any other spiritual gifts you recognize in them.

The purpose of this activity is to teach children the difference between a physical and spiritual gift.

Gather two small paper bags or bowls. Use the labels below to attach to the bags/bowls (one on each bag). Cut out the images. Introduce this activity by reading the parable of the talents in Matthew 25:14-30. Explain to your children that talents in these scriptures refers to money, but it can also refer to gifts God has given us. You may also want to read about some spiritual gifts in True to the Faith in the Gospel Library under "Spiritual Gifts." Then, help your children sort the gift images into the bags as you dicuss each gift.

For more fun, cut out each image and place inside a small gift box. Let your children open each gift and then sort the image.
