PRINTING

The majority of our downloads are formatted to print on 8.5x11" paper unless otherwise noted. You may print at home or a local print shop. We recommend using a recent version of Adobe Acrobat PDF Reader to view and print your files. It is available for free online. If you run into problems with pages being cut off, select "fit to page" in your print dialogue box to make sure it fits on your page correctly.

To print large page sizes (anything larger than 8.5x11"), we recommend going to a local print shop like Kinko's, Staples, AlphaGraphics, etc. and ask them to print your file as a black and white "engineer print" or "blueprint." These larger prints are big, fun and fairly inexpensive.

If the staff at your print shop asks you about your rights to reproduce this work, you will find a copyright release below. Or you can tell them you downloaded these files for personal use from comefollowmefhe.com and they can look us up to see if you do have the rights to print the copies.

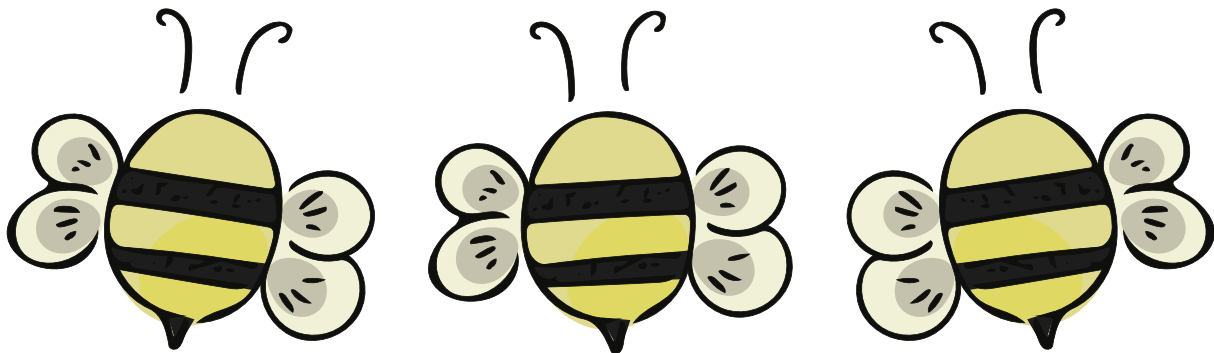
“Bee” a Covenant Keeper

To prepare for this activity, hide a set of scriptures in a large pile of blankets or inside a tall tower built with blocks. Invite your children to search for the scriptures. When they find them, explain that this is similar to what happened to King Josiah and his people. The high priest discovered a book of covenants in the temple that the people had forgotten. Read, listen to, or summarize the story found in 2 Kings 22:8-11.

Tell your children that the scriptures contain the commandments and covenants from the Lord. Ask if they know what a covenant is. You can look it up in the Bible Dictionary to help explain it in simple terms. Hang the “Bee a Covenant Keeper” beehive printout on the wall. Ask your children what covenants they can make when they are young. Talk about baptism and the covenants made at baptism, such as taking upon themselves the name of Jesus Christ, mourning with those who mourn, and comforting those in need of comfort.

Then, have each child write “I can be a covenant keeper” on a bee and sign their name. Let them hang their bees around the large beehive. Discuss as a family how each person can keep their covenants.

You can also use the bee handouts! Simply attach Burt’s Beeswax chapstick or a bee-themed treat, like Bit-O-Honey, in the empty space.
