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Pointing to the Savior Rock Painting

ISAIAH 14:3, 25:8, 28:16

This week, your goal is to help others to be pointed toward the Savior—just as Isaiah pointed us to Christ.

Throughout the book of Isaiah, we see that his teachings consistently direct our hearts and minds to the Savior. With your family, talk about things that remind you of Jesus Christ—for example, the sun, light, or rocks.

Start by finding scriptures that talk about the Savior. These can be verses your family already knows, or ones you find using the Topical Guide or Bible Dictionary. Make a list of these meaningful scriptures together.

Next, go outside and let each person collect two or three rocks. (If you don't have rocks nearby, you can usually find them at Walmart or a local craft store.) Wash the rocks and let them dry completely.

Then, paint each rock. On every rock, write a scripture reference about Christ and paint a simple image or symbol that reminds you of Him. Let the paint dry.

Optional: After the rocks are dry, you may want to spray them with a finishing craft spray to help preserve the paint.

Once finished, go for a family walk and hide the rocks for others to find. You might try placing them around your neighborhood or along the edges of walking paths at a local park. As people discover the rocks, they'll be gently pointed to the Savior through your family's simple, creative act of sharing His light.
